Feel free to give it a go, however!</p> <p>-</p> <p>Alternatively, take the easy road, by reading The Tale of Troy, by Roger Lancelyn Green, available as an Audiobook or on Amazon.</p> <p>-</p> <p>OR why not try Homer's Iliad as an Audiobook?! The Naxos edition, read by Anton Lesser, looks pretty good.</p>	<p>Statues</p> <p>Temple statues</p> <p>Vases</p> <p>-</p> <p>READ is a bit of a misnomer here – you can't read a statue or a vase.</p> <p>-</p> <p>So, why not start by having a look at</p> <p>-the New York Kouros</p> <p>-the Temple of Artemis pediment</p> <p>-the Gorgons pursuing Perseus vase</p>
